SPORTSMANSHIP CARD

Sportsmanship card must be read to all players, coaches and spectators prior to the start of each game on the spectators' side of the field

It is the referee's discretion to terminate the game if any threatening statements are made or for anyone entering the field of play without permission.







LAW 16- GOAL KICK



RESTART

- Ball is placed anywhere in the goal area
- Opponent needs to be outside the penalty area prior to kick
- Ball is active once kicked

POSITIONING ON A GOAL KICK

All attackers must be and remain **outside** of penalty area. The opposing team can enter the penalty area when the ball is kicked and moves.

LAW 12 – FOULS & MISCONDUCTS



MAJOR (PENAL) FOULS

Law 12 says:

A direct free kick is awarded to the opposing team if a player commits any of the following seven offenses in a manner considered by the referee to be *careless, reckless* or using *excessive force*:



DEFINITIONS:

Careless:

Player shows lack of attention or consideration toward opponent when challenging for the ball.



DEFINITIONS:

Reckless:

When a player acts with disregard to the danger to, or consequences for, an opponent



DEFINITIONS:

Excessive Force:

When a player exceeds the necessary use of force and endangers the safety of an opponent



MAJOR (PENAL) FOULS

1. Kicks or attempts to kick an opponent
2. Trips or attempts to trip an opponent
3. Jumps at an opponent
4. Strikes or attempts to strike an opponent
5. Charges dangerously an opponent



MAJOR (PENAL) FOULS

6. Pushes an opponent
7. Tackles or challenges an opponent to gain possession of the ball, making contact with the opponent before touching the ball





KICK-OFF



The team that wins the coin toss can now chose to take the kick-off OR choose a goal to attack

If that team chooses possession of the ball, the other team may choose which goal to attack


Total Referees for 2023

- 440 Referees in RI
- 229 were 17 or younger ~ 50%
- As of March 2nd, there are only 229 Registered Referees in the State of Rhode Island.
- 199 Referees remain uncertified

What's Happening and Why?



- Abuse and Mistreatment remains the #1 reason officials leave the profession according to every major study/survey
 - Please remember, Assault, Abuse, Mistreatment are all different things
- New referees need about 100 games before they are comfortable on the field
 - If a referee does ~ 6 games a weekend, that's about 16-17 weekends
- Referees need to be continuous learning and practicing their craft.
 - Self lead training
 - Practical Field experience
 - Coaching
 - There are currently 13 Referee Mentors/Coaches in the State or RI
 - That's 1 Mentor to every 34 referees.



What can you do?

- Be a role model for your players and parents
- Be an advocate for the official(s), especially when there is no one there supporting them
- Demonstrate strong leadership
- Focus on your players behaviors and skills in game
- Learn about the Laws of the Game.

Mistakes aren't failures, they're opportunities for growth. Those opportunities will present themselves in many ways and often at the most inopportune time for a team. Be prepared for how you will handle that situation.

ONLINE GAME CHANGE SYSTEM

THE SUPER LIGA “Online Game Change System” will allow coaches and competitive directors to conduct game changes through the **SUPER LIGA** website .

- NOTE: The competitive director for where the game is being played will have the final approve the game change.
-



GAME CHANGE PERIOD

- August 17 > August 31.
 - Any game can be changed if both coaches and the coordinator of where the game is being played, agree.
 - Date, Time and Field can be changed.
 - No new game changes after August 30.
-

PLAYING FORMATS

- 7U-8U 4v4 No GK
 - Max Roster 8 players
- 9U-10U 7v7 with GK / Buildout Line
 - Max Roster 14 players
- 11U-12U 9v9
 - Max Roster 16 Players
- 13U-17U 11v11
 - Player pool of 22 players, 18 players per game



Safe Soccer Goals

- **ALL GOALS MUST BE ANCHORED PROPERLY PRIOR TO ANY SOCCER BEING PLAYED ON ANY SOCCER FIELD.**
- Home Team Responsibility
- Referees will not start the game without the Goals anchored properly



RESCHEDULING

• Due to Weather

- Coaches will have **6 days** from the date the game was cancelled to have the game rescheduled.
- Games will be rescheduled thru the online game change system.
- Home coach will contact the opposing coach and provide three dates for the opposing coach to choose from.
- Once an agreement is reached, the home coach will enter the reschedule online, the opposing coach will approve, and the home team competitive director will also approve.
- After the home team competitive director approves the game , the game will be updated on the Super Liga website.
- If an agreement cannot be reached by the deadline, the Super Liga will schedule the game.



IN SEASON SPECIAL GAME CHANGE REQUEST

- A special game change request can be made with at least a 4 day notice from the original game date.
- The special game change request must be emailed to Oscar DeLemos, odelemos@thesuperliga.com, and accompany with the reason for the change and the reschedule date and time of the game.
- Super Liga will confirm with opposing association/club competitive director and upon confirmation will then update the game on the website.
- There will be a fee of \$50 for every game change approved.

CLUB PASS POLICY

Divisions

1. Anchor/Open
2. Classic
3. Classic Gold ***
4. Classic Blue ***
5. Rhody

**** Age groups will have either a single division Classic OR separate divisions Classic Gold, Classic Blue*

All Age Groups

1. Players can move up or laterally in a division or age group.
2. Players cannot move down divisions in any circumstances.
3. Players who play up in a higher age group can only move to an equal/higher division in their qualified age group.



CLUB PASS POLICY

Substitutes

Age Groups 7U-12U can Club Pass to a maximum of four (4) substitutes

Age Groups 13U-19U can Club Pass to a maximum of six (6) substitutes

Dual Rostered Players

The highest ranked division is used for applying the Club Pass Policy

Administrative

1. All players must be rostered to at least one team
2. Club Pass players' names are manually written on the game day roster
3. Club Pass players cannot be used for playoffs and championships
4. Girls can play on boys teams
5. Boys cannot play on girls teams

Penalty

Violations of the policy results in a game forfeit, fine, and coach's one (1) game suspension



PLAYER DUAL ROSTER POLICY

Any Super Liga player can be dual rostered within their association/club for Super Liga play.

- A player rostered to an Anchor or Open team, cannot be dual rostered on a Rhody team.
- No team can have more the 40% of their roster with dual rostered players.
 - Ex. 16 total players on the roster, $40\% = 6.4$ > Rounded down to - 6 players.
 - Ex. 14 total players on the roster, $40\% = 5.6$ > Rounded up to - 6 players.
- Dual rostered players must play 3 games for both teams that they are rostered to. Violation of this part of the policy will result if one of the teams the player is registered for is the divisional winner, the team would be disqualified.



GOAL DIFFERENTIAL POLICY

THE SUPER LIGA will not record a final score of more than a 4-goal differential for any game.

- **Goal differential policy does not apply to 7U/8U age groups.**
- **Age Groups: 9U-17U**

If the Goal Differential during the game reaches 6, the team trailing can add a player to the game. The trailing team can continue to add a player to the game for every additional goal up to a Goal Differential of 8.

Ex. 6 GD add a player, 7 GD add another player, 8 GD add one more player. If the GD reaches 8, the trailing team would have been able to add 3 additional players.

- If the trailing team scores a goal after adding a player, the player added must be removed from the field of play.



GOAL DIFFERENTIAL POLICY

If a team's winning score of a Super Liga game is a nine-goal differential:

- First Offense- A warning.
- Second Offense, a point deduction from the standings.

If a team's winning score of a Super Liga game is a ten-goal differential or more:

- The coach will be suspended for the following two Super Liga games and a point deducted for the standings.

If both coaches agree by the end of the game, they can opt out of the Goal Differential Policy. The referee must be notified, and a note must be made in the game report, signed by both coaches.

NOTE: If an unordinary situation occurs Super Liga will have discretion.



PLAYERS & COACHES PASSES

- Every Player and Coach must have a current USYS Pass.
- The passes can be a physical laminated pass or a virtual pass on any mobile device.






USF HEADING POLICY



When a player deliberately heads the ball in a game....

An indirect free kick (IFK) will be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense

If a player does not deliberately head the ball, then play should continue.

If the deliberate header occurs within the goal area, the indirect free kick will be taken on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the point nearest to where the infringement occurred



SUPER LIGA HEAD TRAUMA POLICY



- Player cannot return to any soccer player until Super Liga receives medical clearance from the player's health care provider.
- Medical Clearance Notes need to be emailed to director@thesuperliga.com
- Upon receipt of the notes, Super Liga communicate with the coordinator and coach, that the player will be allowed to resume soccer activity.

LIGHTNING POLICY

- Coaches and Referees need to communicate with each other prior to start of game- if there are thunderstorms in the forecast during the game.
- If lightning is observed by any referee or coaches, the referee will stop the game immediately.
- Referee must wait 20 Minutes between observing lightning before the game can resume.
- **Maximum 40-minute delay before terminating game**

- Game terminated in the 1st half
 - Referee crew keeps half the game fee
- Game terminated at half-time and beyond
 - Referee crew keeps game fee.






LAW 7 – DURATION OF THE MATCH

- 4 Quarters – 12 minutes each

LAW 8 - THE START AND RESTART OF PLAY

- Restart after a goal: From the center circle.

LAW 10 - THE METHOD OF SCORING

- Conform to FIFA rules

LAW 11 - OFFSIDES

- There will be no offsides.

LAW 12 – FOULS & MISCONDUCTS

- Conform with FIFA with the following modifications...
- All fouls will be INDIRECT FREE KICKS
- opponent 5 yards away
- Fouls inside the goal box will result in ball being placed 5 yards outside the goal box (this allows opponent to establish a wall)
- The referee shall explain all infractions to the offending players

LAW 13 – FREE KICKS


- All FREE KICKS will be INDIRECT
- opponent must be 5 yards away from the ball

LAW 16 – GOAL KICK

- All FREE KICKS will be INDIRECT
- opponent must retrieve to midfield and not cross over until ball is put into play.



9U-10U PLAYING FORMAT AND RULES

BUILD OUT LINES

The build out line promotes playing the ball out of the back in a less pressured setting.

- When the goalkeeper has the ball in his or her hands during play from the opponent, the opposing team must move behind the build out line until the ball is put into play.
- Once the opposing team is behind the build out line, the goalkeeper can pass, throw or roll the ball into play (punts and drop kicks are not allowed).



9U-10U PLAYING FORMAT AND RULES

BUILD OUT LINES

- After the ball is put into play by the goalkeeper, the opposing team can cross the build out line and play resumes as normal.
- The opposing team must also move behind the build out line during a goal kick until the ball is put into play.
- If a goalkeeper punts or drop kicks the ball, an indirect free kick should be awarded to the opposing team from the spot of the offense.
- If the punt or drop kick occurs within the goal area, the indirect free kick should be taken on the goal area line parallel to the goal line at the nearest point to where the infringement occurred.



9U-10U PLAYING FORMAT AND RULES

BUILD OUT LINES

- The build out line will also be used to denote where offside offenses can be called. Players cannot be penalized for an offside offense between the halfway line and the build out line. Players can be penalized for an offside offense between the build out line and the goal line .
- Ideally, the goalkeeper will wait to put the ball into play once all opponents are past the build out line. However, the goalkeeper can put the ball into play sooner.
